# Regular Monthly Meeting 10 a.m. Wednesday, July 5, 2017 Mayors' Council Conference Room Hagåtña, Guam

President Mayor Paul McDonald announced and gave the floor Russell Campbell, Territorial Entomologist with Dept. of Agriculture and Glenn San Nicolas with Guam EPA who briefly spoke on green waste disposal, *Fire Ants* and *Rhino Beetles* by helping mayors get rid of the accumulation of green waste that already exist. Agencies involved are the departments of Agriculture, Guam EPA, Fire, Public Works, and governor's representative Eric Palacios. Mayors were asked to identify as soon as possible existing sites with accumulations of green or brown waste so that they could begin checking for *Fire Ants* and create an inventory of piles to be burned.

There is an emergency declaration from the governor to get rid of these existing piles and get this program finished by December 1, 2017 but long term, once this program is done, they will work on setting up a long term comprehensive sustainable green waste management program to the villages green waste problems. Mr. San Nicolas said this would be the waste that is generated by mayors' offices from their operations at this time and then moving forward there would be a plan to address all the other concerns associated with the generation of green waste such as the land developments and smaller projects because of this invasive species situation.

President Mayor Paul McDonald expressed that the group had met with the Executive Officers who recommended designating a northern, central, and southern site for the air curtain burners. Mayors were asked to have a consolidation site in their village for a small pile from one to five cubic yards where DPW will pick up and bring to these designated locations.

Residents would be allowed to burn green waste without a permit provided it is controlled and in a barrel. Mayor Robert Hofmann would send to all Districts a *Risk Management* form for residents that lays out rules.

#### VIII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

a. **LIBERATION FESTIVITIES** – *President* gave congratulations to the committees. If not for the help from the *Queen's* Committee, the Liberation festivities would have failed. Although the *Carnival* is on going it is not going well.

Queen's Committee - Chair Mayor Louise Rivera expressed that on the contest packet it was not caught or was not communicated correctly, because it was supposed to be 50% for those who raised over \$10K and it would be up to the mayor and candidate how to split the proceeds. Mayor Rivera said she would like to let it stand and have it corrected because the glitch was on the document. The Committee met and approved that it must be applied immediately and the final decision was that 50% of the proceeds go to the candidate and sponsor \$10K and over, 40% to those who made \$5K to \$9,999, and 30% to those who made \$1,501 to \$4,999. Mayor Robert Hofmann stated that the formula never changed for the past four years.

Carnival – Several mayors expressed there is hardly no people there. President said a final report would come out after the festivities are over and there would be a recommendation to maybe negotiate with the Legislature to at least approve color games and/or beto beto.

- b. **MCOG 40<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY** Mayor Melissa Savares said she is trying to setup mass. As part of the sister-city relations, visitors are coming from La Trinidad, Philippines. Mayor suggested having the group of twelve attend mass and tie-in a proclamation signing. She had communicated with Oyaol Ngirairikl with the Governor's Office.
- c. EMPLOYEE APPRECIATION PICNIC Saturday, November 4, 2017 at Port Authority Beach Chairman Mayor Rudy Matanane/Co-chair Mayor Allan Ungacta.

  Mayor Matanane called for a meeting 2 pm, Thursday, August 3 at Council's conference room. At this time a copy of the menu was being circulated. *President* announced to send a representative if you are not able to attend.
